School Readiness



Head Start is Idaho's must successful school readiness program. That means Head Start children are ready for school, Head Start families are ready to support their children's learning, and elementary schools are ready for Head Start children. Physical, cognitive, social, and emotional development are essential parts of school readiness. Head Start children possess the skills, knowledge, and attitudes they need to succeed in school and life.

Head Start respects parents as their children's primary nurturers, teachers, and advocates. Programs are required to consult with parents in establishing school readiness goals. As children transition to kindergarten, Head Start works to promote school readiness and engage families.

Birth to Five



Head Start and Early Head Start are early education programs for children age 0-5 from atrisk backgrounds. Children are learning from the moment they are born. Brain growth, approaches to life and learning, and language skills are shaped by what does - or does not - happen in a child's first days, months and years. Investment in the early years prevents children from falling behind and decreases the need for expensive remedial education.

Head Start recognizes the critical role of parents and teaches parents how to support their children's learning. Head Start also helps parents overcome the challenges of poverty that can stand in the way of their children's success.

COVID-19



When Covid-19 forced the closure of Head Start classrooms across Idaho, the staff continued to provide learning opportunities for children, interactive activities for families and at-home learning exercises. For parents, Head Start continued to provide parenting classes and activities, resources for mental and physical health, and assistance with food, clothing, housing, and finances.

"This pandemic has exacerbated the families' ability to obtain food and feel secure about where their next meal will come from. We stayed in constant contact with families. The positive feedback we received from families was overwhelming with many stating they didn't think they would have made it without our support."

Children's Health and Welfare

HEAD START SUPPORTS CHILD HEALTH AND WELFARE

Poverty too often goes together with poor health. For more than 55 years, Head Start has integrated health care access, immunizations, vision and hearing screenings, and developmental supports into the comprehensive services they offer. Early identification and intervention, especially in the case of developmental delays, can have lasting positive impacts. Screening early matters, and this is what Head Start does best.



Idaho's youngest generation faces many health challenges stemming from COVID-19, including lost opportunities for critical vaccines and early intervention. Without access to doctors for routine checkups and specialists to identify and treat disabilities or delays, children could suffer unnecessarily for years, ultimately undermining their full potential. Head Start's comprehensive health services address critical needs and contribute to the success of children and families.

Advocacy

INVEST NOW TO SERVE MORE CHILDREN

Head Start's federal funding is not enough to serve all the Idaho families that qualify. More than 2,000 children are on Head Start waiting lists across the state. The Idaho Head Start Association urges state lawmakers to make a \$1 million investment in Head Start to enroll 100 more children. This is a cost-effective step toward improving school readiness, literacy rates and future success. This cost could be more than offset with savings in remedial education, corrections, foster care and Medicaid.

Parent Leadership

Parents oversee Policy Councils for each program, making important decisions about staffing, curriculum and program operations. This experience helps them develop leadership skills and self-confidence. They become better advocates for their children and more engaged citizens.
